The World Cup season openers in Ruka and Gällivare has offered excitement, hope, and motivation for our World Cup racers along with those gearing up for the SuperTour races in December.

Rosie Brennan captured back to back podium finishes in Ruka, placing 2nd in the 10km Classic race (*photo right from U.S. Ski Team*) and 3rd in the 20km Freestyle pursuit. She currently is ranked 2nd in the World! Rosie's performance along with some other outstanding results from our APU World Cup team affirms that the work our coaches and athletes have put in to help our skiers prepare and train for the race season is a job well done. In Gällivare, the U.S. Men's relay team consisting of APU Skiers Gus Schumacher, Scott



Patterson, Zanden McMullen, and U.S. teammate, Ben Ogden, placed 5th overall, one of the best men's relay finishes for the U.S. in over 20 years. Luke Jager and JC Schoonmaker's team *(Men's teams photo right from U.S. Ski Team)* finished close behind in 8th place. Novie McCabe is currently 2nd in the U23 World Cup rankings! We look forward to local races starting in December in Anchorage and to February for the World Cup Races in Minnesota. We hope there will be a large contingent APU Contingency in the Lower-48 and we are excited to see how our APU skiers do at home in the USA.

Projects have filled every day in our coaches lives since the beginning of 2023. Many are currently underway with much more to be done to get each project operational. Here's a quick Overview.

Thomas Training Center on Eagle Glacier

We are excited to report on the NEW Thomas Training Center Facility on Eagle Glacier is underway! In 2023, APU purchased a Rollerski Treadmill that will be delivered to APU at the beginning of 2024. The treadmill will live in the weight room in the Atwood Building at APU.
